Kevin and the Turkey

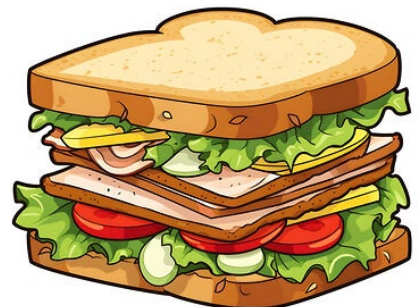

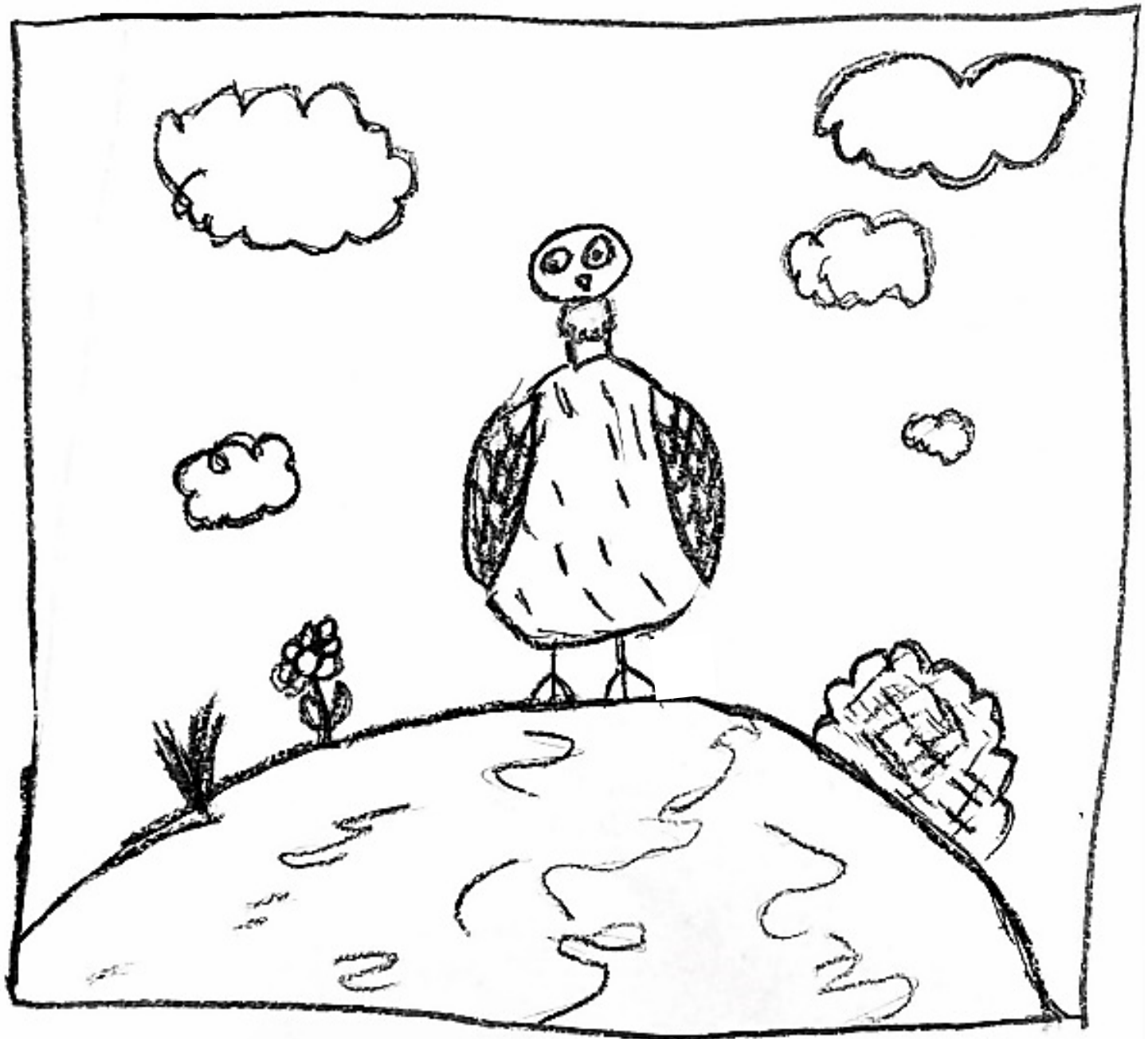
The Thanksgiving Sandwich Contest

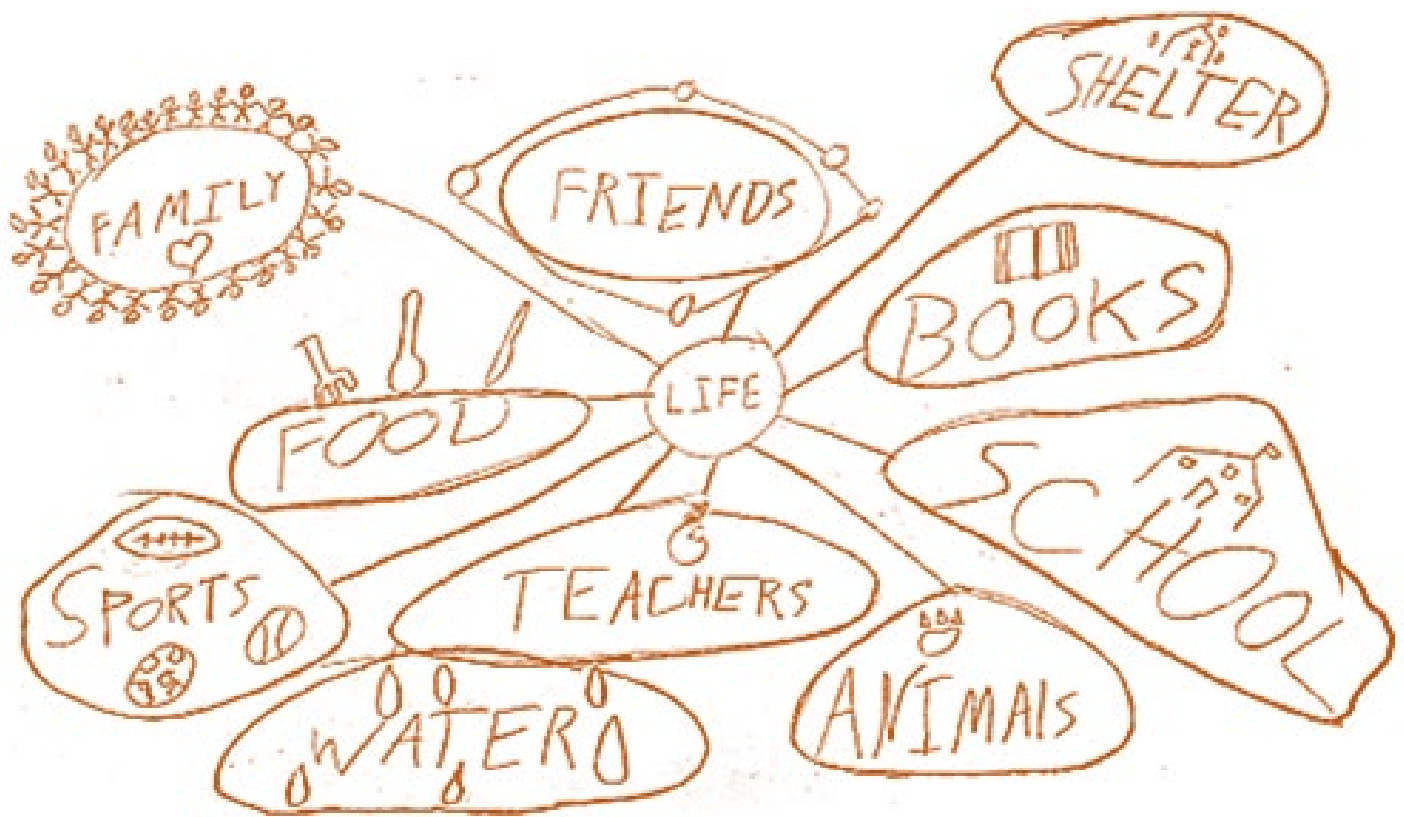

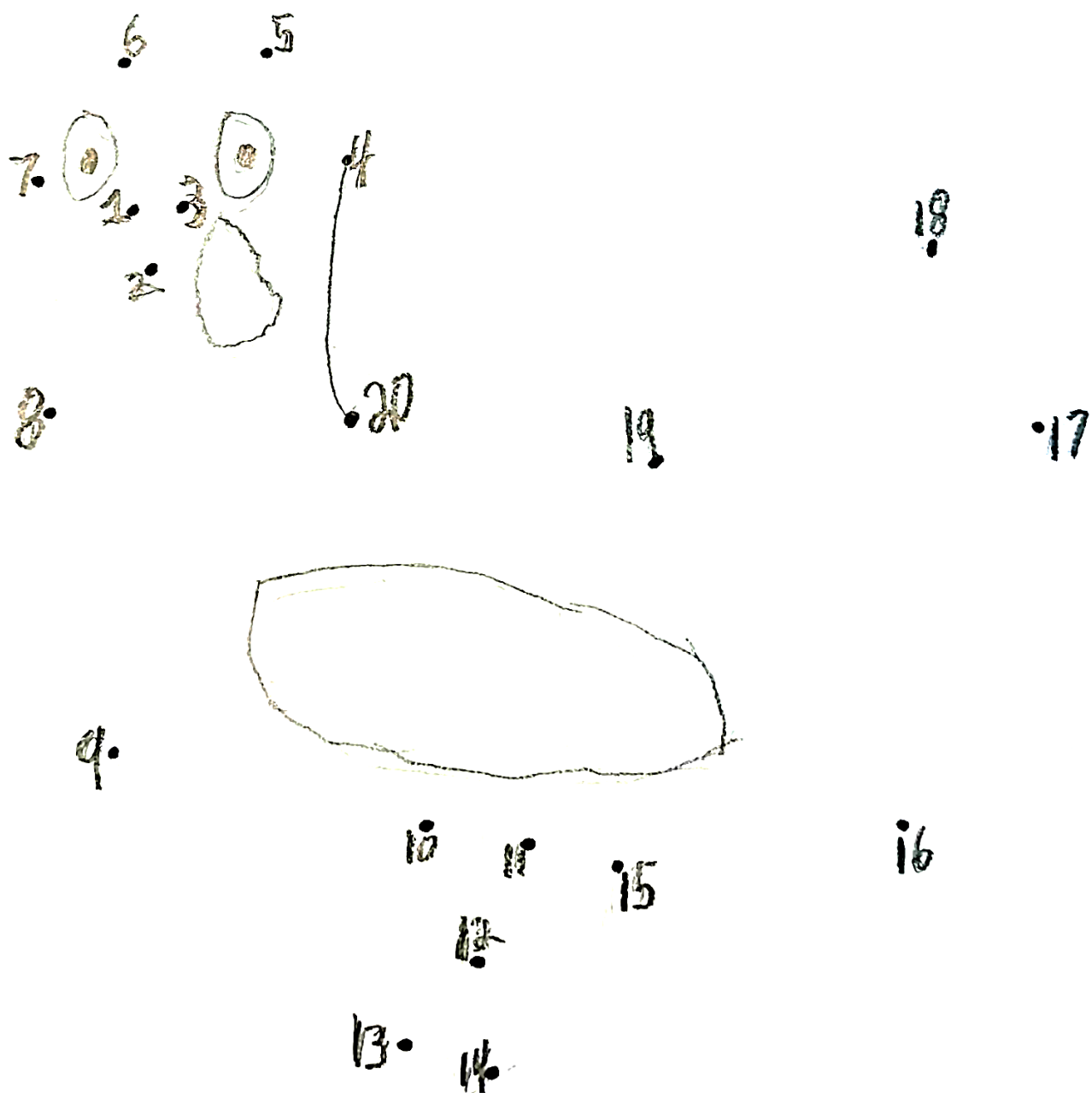
Can you color all that you are thankful for?
